High school senior/graduate Hannah Tessel (pictured left) led a campaign for CCOC at her high school this past Spring


and raised over \$7,000! Hannah took initiative by selling CCOC sweatshirts to the Ma'ayanot Yeshiva High School for Girls' student body.

1990: On April 26, 1986, a nuclear reactor in the Ukrainian city of Chernobyl explodes, releasing four hundred times more radioactive material than had been released during the atomic bombing of Hiroshima. Over the follow ing years, cancer rates and birth defects begin to skyrocket, and the impact of ne nuclear meltdown causes people in the region to suffer physically, menta ly, and financially. As the children of the Chernobyl region start to mature the effects of the radiation on so many of them become increasingly apparent By 1990, the radiation from the explosion reaches epidemic proportions, and that same year, the Rebbe asks Chabadniks to "take upon yours oonsibility for the well-being of these children and bring them to Israel." On August 3, 1990, Chabad successfully arranges the first rescue flight, and 196 children are brought to Israel, where they are provided with housing, education, and medical care. As of 2013, Chabad has arranged ninety-nine rescue flights, bringing 2,863 children to Israel, Chabad's Children of Chernoby (CCOC) maintains a collaborative relationship with the World Health Organi zation, UNESCO, and the United Nations Department of Humanitarian A fairs. Both Jewish and non-Jewish children are served. For those children who cannot leave the Chernobyl region, CCOC sends medical equipment, medi cine, and other necessary supplies to the contaminated area.
